Woore Primary and Nursery school has 60 families on roll including the nursery. Eleven families responded to the survey which equates to 18% of the number of families.

7. Additional comments made with regard to safety on the school site:
 - An observation has been made that visitors are not observing the 'Keep to the Path' sign. It was suggested that a fence be installed between the fence and the car park.
 - The amount of cars on the car park are a concern at drop off and pick up times. A question of whether rules are being enforced was asked.

With regards to these comments, messages continue to go out to parents/carers on 'keeping to the path' and parking on the school site. It is not always possible for a member of staff to man this each day and would ask if parents could politely adhere to the rules in place. At this current time, funds for a fence separating the path to the car park are not available.
